Summary

Tennessee's July seasonally adjusted unemployment rate remained at 3.5% for the third consecutive month.

Over the past year, Tennessee's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate remained 3.5% while the national rate declined from 4.3% to 3.9%.

Total nonfarm employment increased 2,500 jobs from June to July. The largest increases occurred in education/ health services, professional/business services, & manufacturing.

Over the year, nonfarm employment increased 56,300 jobs. The largest increases occurred in leisure/hospitality, professional/business services, & education/health services.
