Summary

Tennessee's May seasonally adjusted unemployment rate increased slightly to 3.3% from the revised rate of 3.2%.

Over the past year, Tennessee's unemployment rate decreased from 3.6% to 3.3% while the national rate declined from 3.8% to 3.6%.

Total nonfarm employment increased 3,900 jobs from April to May. The largest increases occurred in accommodation/food services, wholesale trade & nondurable goods manufacturing.

Over the year, nonfarm employment increased 47,400 jobs. The largest increases occurred in leisure/hospitality, trade/transportation/utilities & manufacturing.
